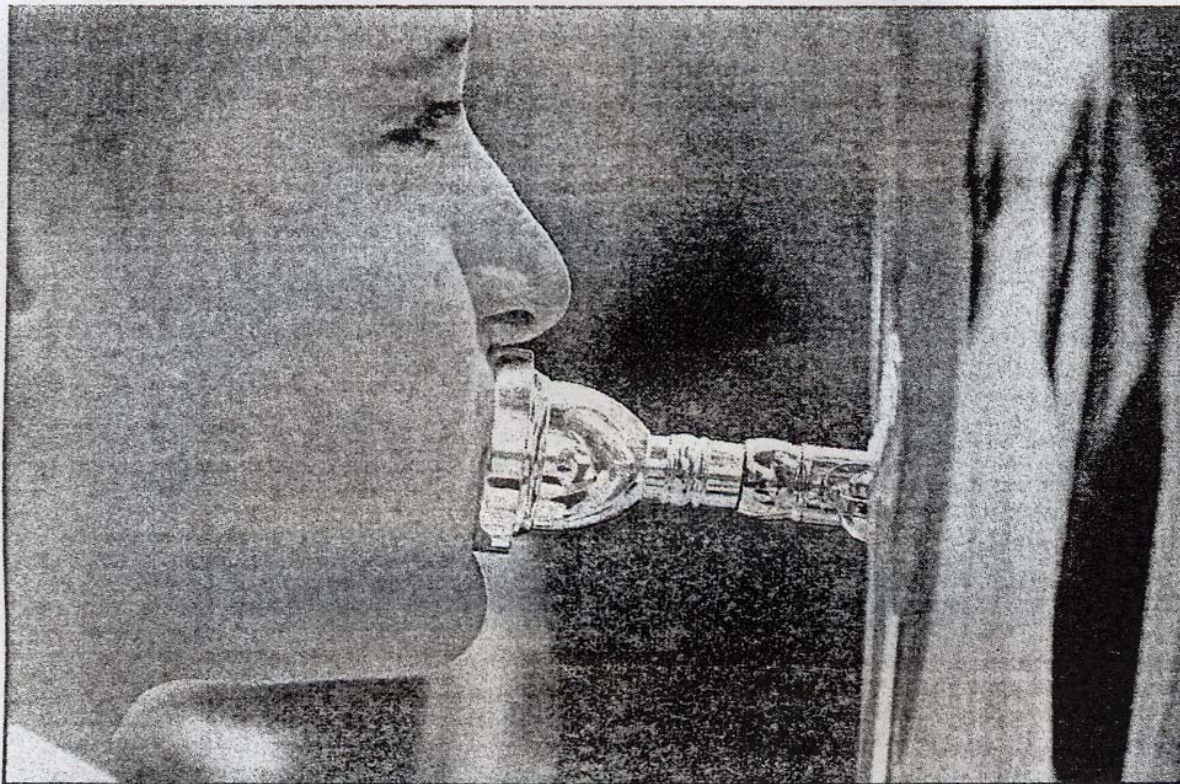

STREET SOUNDS: Young musicians made the most of Brighton's new-look cultural quarter by performing hip-hop, funk and reggae tunes they had written themselves.

Pupils from Brighton and Hove primary schools played on African drums, keyboards and guitars in New Road as part of a city-wide Soundmakers scheme which aims to give every child the chance to make music.

The event was organised by Brighton and Hove Music Trust and involved school musicians from Goldstone Primary in Hove, Peter Gladwin Primary in Portslade and Fairlight Primary in Brighton.

It was part of a wider campaign to raise £100,000 to buy more instruments for the musicians. Some were bought with money contributed by The Argus Appeal.
